How do I join?

Parents or legal guardians complete a membership form and present a photo identification and proof of residency in Bermuda to the library staff. Our services are available to all children from birth to age 18. Registration takes only five minutes and you can check out books immediately afterwards. We only charge for lost or damaged library books, date-due cards or library cards. You may borrow up to four books for three weeks at a time. You must present your Library card in order to check out library materials.
